April 25-27, 2016

Presidential race

A total of 800 Minnesota registered voters were interviewed April 25-27. The self-identified party affiliation of the respondents is 38 percent Democrats (306), 31 percent Republicans (247) and 31 percent independents or other (247). Margin of sampling error is +3.5 percentage points; for questions asked of Democrats the margin of sampling error is +5.7 percentage points, and for Republicans it is +6.4 percentage points.
